



**GREG ABBOTT** *Governor of Texas*

As the 48th Governor of Texas, Greg Abbott continues to build on his long record as a conservative leader who fights to preserve Texas values like faith, family and freedom. Under his leadership, Texas again leads the nation in job creation due in part to successes from his first legislative session. His achievements from the most recent legislative session are forging an even broader path to prosperity for more Texas families by building on safety and security, education, economic advancement and the preservation of liberty. Prior to his 2014 election, he was the 50th and longestserving Attorney General of Texas. He also previously served as a Justice on the Texas Supreme Court and a State District Judge in Harris County. He was born in Wichita Falls, TX and raised in Duncanville, TX. After graduating from The University of Texas at Austin with a BBA in finance, he earned a law degree from Vanderbilt University Law School. Shortly after graduating from law school, he was partially paralyzed by a falling tree while jogging. He and his wife, Cecilia, a former teacher and principal, and the first Hispanic First Lady of Texas, were married in 1981. Their daughter, Audrey, is a college student.

During his tenure as Governor, he has been very keen on strengthening the friendship between Aichi and Texas, and signed a Memorandum of Understanding on Agreement of Friendship and Mutual Cooperation with Texas Governor Greg Abbott in April 2016. Prior to serving as Governor, he has held numerous political and bureaucratic positions in Japan, including at the Japanese Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fishers from April 1982; as a Diet Member in the House of Representatives for five terms from October 1996; as the Parliamentary Secretary of Economy, Trade and Industry from May 2001; as the Parliamentary Secretary of the Cabinet Office; as the Senior Vice Minister of the Cabinet Office; as the Senior Vice Minister of Health, Labour and Welfare; and as the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Audit and Oversight of Administration, House of Representatives. He holds an LL.B. from Tokyo University (March 1982). Governor Ohmura and his wife, Fumiko, were married in 1987. They have a son and three daughters.



He is amongst the first, if not the first, to use Intensity-Modulated Proton Therapy (IMPT) to treat head and neck tumors. He is the Principal Investigator of an NIH/ NCI-sponsored Phase II/III randomized trial in oropharyngeal cancer that compares outcomes after chemoradiation given by IMRT vs IMPT. His company, C4 Imaging, has funding from the NIH, the Prostate Cancer Foundation, the Texas Ignition Fund, Hitachi and MD Anderson. He has served as past President and Chairman of the Board of the American Brachytherapy Society and chaired the American Board of Radiology's Oral Examinations Program for head and neck cancer.




**GENE WU** Representative, Texas House of Representatives






