Eleni KOUNALAKIS Lieutenant Governor, State of California



Ambassador Kounalakis was sworn in as the 50th Lieutenant Governor of California by Governor Gavin Newsom in January 2019. She is a native Californian and the first woman to be elected as the state's lieutenant governor. From 2010 to 2013, Ambassador Kounalakis served as President Obama's Ambassador to the Republic of Hungary. She was the first Greek American woman—and one of America's youngest—to serve as U.S. Ambassador. She holds a B.A. from Dartmouth College, an MBA from UC Berkeley and an Honorary Doctorate of Laws from the American College of Greece.

Christopher J. DODD Senior Counsel, Arnold & Porter; Former Chairman & Chief Executive Officer, Motion Picture Association of America



Senator Dodd brings strategic counsel to Arnold & Porter's clients seeking to address governmental, political and business challenges. Senator Dodd previously served in the U.S. Congress for more than three decades. He was Chairman of the Senate Committee on Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs and on the Committees on Foreign Relations (including its East Asia subcommittee) and Health, Education, Labor and Pensions. Laws that he authored include the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, as well as the Family and Medical Leave Act. After leaving government service in 2011, Senator Dodd joined the Motion Picture Association of America.

Kenichiro MUKAI Minister, Head of Chancery, Embassy of Japan in the United State of America



Serving in his current role since August 2018, Mr. Mukai oversees general affairs, including VIP visits between Japan and the United States, annual events at the Ambassador's residence, and strengthening relations with states, governors and Japanese American communities. An Arabic-speaking diplomat, he has held positions that include: Deputy Chief of Mission, Embassy of Japan in Egypt; Director of the First and Second Middle East Divisions at Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs; Minister-Counsellor, Embassy of Japan in Iraq; and Counsellor, Japan's Permanent Mission to the United Nations. He holds a B.A. from Kyoto University and studied at University of Michigan.

Ms. Itsuno is a fifth-year medical student at Keio University in Tokyo, currently conducting neurophysiological research while doing her clinical rotations.
