

About USJC

- USJC invests in the *next generation* of leaders from the United States and Japan



The Toshizo Watanabe Study Abroad Scholarship

- Created in 2016
- Named for Mr. Toshizo Watanabe, a successful Japanese businessman who had a life-changing SAB experience in the United States
- Supports international study in either the U.S. or Japan
- Decrease financial burden of international study
- Give opportunity to those with *leadership* experience/potential & no previous int'l experience







About the Scholarship



- Award <u>up to</u> the full cost of attendance (COA)
- Undergraduate and graduate students
- Any field of study or major
- Minimum 1 semester ~ 1 year (*No summer or January term support*)
- Any or approved program/center

(*no language schools*)

- U.S. Japan
- Students with financial need (*determined by student not USJC*)
- No fixed scholarship amount



Who is Eligible?



1) U.S. citizens and permanent residents

- 2) Currently enrolled student in good standing at a high school, college or university in the US, or degree-seeking student currently studying in Japan
- 3) Will be in a credit-bearing, academic content course at a college, university or approved study center* **Language schools/Bridge Programs are <u>NOT</u> eligible**

4) Has financial need

5) Preference given to students who are:

- a) from single parent households
- b) orphans (or wards of the state)
- c) first-generation
- d)Those with no international experience



Application Requirements



- Online Application Form
 (Deadline March 7, 2022 US Eastern Time)
- All materials in English
- Essay(s)
- Resume
- Recommendation letter (1)
- SAB certification form*
- Financial certification form*
- Transcripts (optional)
- Language proficiency scores (not required)
- No interview required

- Well-written and clear
- Address the prompts
- > Follow the page limit guidelines

Stand-out Essay (optional)

- Chance for student to share unique feature/fact about self
- This helps committee to get a clearer sense of the student

Previous International experience

- Explain the context
- How will this time be different?
- Why should we support you going abroad again?

Recommendation

✤English

Address the prompts

- Position doesn't matter, how well they know the student does
- Do <u>NOT</u> send more than one, it will not help and may harm




Online Application and Additional Information



Overview

The Toshizo Watanabe Endowed Scholarship Fund provides financial assistance to undergraduates/graduate students for a semester or year-long study abroad program in either the United States or Japan. A generous endowment gift of \$10 million from Mr. Toshizo (Tom) Watanabe to the U.S.-Japan Council makes it possible to award scholarships to students for whom study abroad would not be possible without financial support.

The scholarship will support up to the full cost of attendance to the study abroad program of the applicant's choice. The scholarship program grants awards to recipients in amounts determined by financial need and other qualifications. 2020 marks the third year to supp American students studying abroad in Japan, and the fifth year for Japanese students studying abroad in the United States.

About the Scholarship The Toshizo Watanabe Endowed Scholarship provides financial assistance to undergraduates or a semester or year-lon abroad program in either the United States or Japan. This scholarship is also open to degree-seeking undergraduate or students in in the U.S. or Japan. A generous endowment gift of \$10 million from Mr. Toshizo (Tom) Watanabe to the U.S. Council funds these scholarships for students for whom study abroad would not be possible without financial support.

The scholarship will support up to the full cost of attendance to the study abroad program/institution of the applicant's che scholarship amount will be determined by the applicant's financial need and other qualifications.

From 2018, scholarships will support Japanese and American students studying abroad in either the United States or respectively.

ligibility

The scholarship will be awarded to college/university students who meet the following criteria.

1. U.S. or Japanese citizens

2. Currently in good academic standing at an accredited college or university in either the United States or Japan 3. Has applied, been accepted or plans to apply to a college/university or approved academic center outside of their country as part of a credit-bearing course of study

- We only have one application cycle (If studying abroad only for Fall 2022 or Spring 2023, students must still apply for this cycle. Same deadlines apply.)
- Apply for study abroad between Fall 2022 Spring 2023
- Link to the online application will be posted on our <u>Watanabe webpage</u>
- Scholarship cannot be deferred



What Makes the Watanabe Scholarship Unique?

- Can **reapply** for more than one year (degree-seeking students/graduate students)
- Can combine the Watanabe Scholarship with other scholarships (up to the full cost of attendance)
- No repayment/work requirements after the completion of your study period
- Can apply at any stage of study abroad planning
- Students apply for the scholarship directly. School has no role in the application process.
- Scholarship is **paid directly to the school**, not the student. (We prefer paying U.S. institutions)
- Scholarship is paid in one lump sum
